

## Sports Premium Plan 2017/2018

In March 2013 the government announced that it was to provide additional funding of **£150 million per annum** for academic years 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools in England - The **Primary PE & Sport Premium**.

This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - is allocated to primary school headteachers. The funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools.

On 17th July 2017 the Department for Education confirmed that the Primary PE & Sport Premium will double from September 2017.

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Schools should ensure that all pupils leave primary school physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport.

Aims and objectives:

Our main aims at Sheringham are to:

1. promote the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - kick-starting healthy active lifestyles;
2. maintain the high profile of PE and sport being across the school as a tool for whole school improvement;
3. increase confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport;
4. broaden experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils;
5. increase participation in competitive sport.

Our objectives include:

- engaging all pupils in activity;
- raising the awareness of healthy lifestyles and engagement in activity;
- reducing obesity levels;
- raising staff confidences to ensure children have opportunities and recognise the importance of active and healthy lifestyles;
- increasing physical wellbeing and ensuring all pupils are challenged.
- developing children's social and leadership skills;
- increasing self-discipline, self-determination and self-confidence;

- ensuring children are future ready;
- ensuring all pupils participate in a type of competition.
