MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Families,

We all hope that you managed to have a lovely relaxing break last week. The weather was absolutely lovely which certainly helps. With everything that has been going on, this academic year seems to have flown by and I cannot believe we are in the last half term already!

With the hopeful lifting of more restrictions in the not too distant future, we too are hoping to resume some more things. Some year groups are planning a local trip out and we will hopefully be able to do the usual transition activities for children moving to their new classes towards the end of this half term. Children will once again be moving up as complete classes as we found this worked really smoothly last year and they will find out who their new teacher will be shortly. Due to wanting to limit large crowds etc we will unfortunately not be having the usual sporting events such as sports days this year but hopefully they will be able to resume again next year – fingers crossed!

Another thing that we introduced this year as part of covid measures but would like to continue next year is the staggered start and finish times. This has really helped on a number of fronts such as reducing the traffic along Cooper Road at one time, cutting the queues for the office team and reducing the number of people on site at any one time making drop offs and collections easier for all. NSPCC NUMBERS DAY 2021

Yet again, for the fifth year, the whole school successfully took part in the NSPCC Numbers Day, celebrating all things number whilst learning about the incredible work that the NSPCC does to help keep children and families safe. The children all dressed up in numbers and did some exciting work with the book, 'Tangram Cat' by Maranke Rinke, exploring the concept of Spatial Reasoning by manipulating and playing with the ancient Chinese puzzle, the Tangram, thought to have originated in China in the 19th Century. The children were able to explore the many and varied ways they could manipulate the shapes (5 triangles, 1 square and 1 parallelogram) and as a result were able to not only discover the many different images that can be created with Tangram but also produced some creative pieces of art inspired by the shapes of the Tangram puzzle.



As well as exploring and playing with the Tangram puzzle, the children also spent some time learning about the Stay Safe initiative created by the NSPCC which highlights the ways in which children can contact the NSPCC via Child Line and helps them to recognise signs of abuse. Importantly, the children learnt that abuse is never their fault and that they should have the courage to seek help by speaking out.
