COVID UPDATE

We are seeing a few more cases of covid in school once again. Whilst we know this is something that we are going to have to learn to live with please be vigilant of any symptoms. Guidance remains as in our last Parent Mail. In a nutshell, if your child has symptoms (other than a high temperature), they can come to school as long as they feel well enough. If they test positive, they should remain at home for three full days after they tested positive. If they have a high temperature for any reason, they should also remain at home. Please do contact us if you are unsure about anything.

GRESHAM STEM FINAL

Winners from two earlier rounds of the Gresham hosted STEM competition for local schools returned to the Dyson Building at Gresham School on Monday 4th July.

The teams took part in a series of STEM challenges, which ranged from aerodynamically shaping a foam car to get the record speed;

programming SPHEROBOTS (small spherical robots) to navigate a course to making paper rockets that flew extraordinary distances on just compressed air - 25 metres plus was not uncommon! Despite their best efforts and coming first in some heats unfortunately neither team was quite able to accrue enough points to take first place. However as always the children represented our school magnificently and thoroughly enjoyed the day, as well as the rather lovely lunch Gresham provided.

As a school we very much look forward to taking part in this competition again next year.

Y6 HAUTBOIS CAMP - JUNE 2022

Sunshine and smiles were in abundance at our Year 6 Summer Camp. This was the first time we made use of the activity centre at Hautbois, and it was a resounding success. Several of our children had never camped before so sleeping under canvas was an exciting new experience – even if it did make for a late night and early morning!

Our days were filled with activities including: bushcraft (fire making), climbing, archery, paddleboarding and raft building to name a few.

The children showed amazing resilience and encouragement towards one another as some challenged themselves with activities outside their usual comfort zone. Our two rules for camp were 'have fun and be kind' – it's safe to say that we more than achieved this.

A big thanks goes to all at Hautbois for helping our children to have such a fantastic time.

SIZEWELL NUCLEAR POWER STATION WRITTEN BY TOBIAS & SUMMER

On the 12th of July 15 students from Sheringham Community Primary School in Year 6 went to Sizewell nuclear power station for the day. They were accompanied by Mr Perrem and Mr Amies. It was an amazing experience for all. When they arrived they were greeted kindly by staff and shown an inspiring slideshow.

The first experiment was moving dry gelatin and oily gelatin from one container to another using only chopsticks. They were timed so they could find the total average and see what was quicker. The average for the dry gelatin was 17.5 seconds however the average for the oily gelatin was 33 seconds meaning it took longer to move the oily gelatin from one container to the other by 15.5 seconds on average. This was a very enjoyable experiment for everyone.



The next experiment was using wires, batteries, lightbulbs and a mini fan to create a working circuit and estimate what was going to happen. The first experiment used a lightbulb that lit up; as we predicted. We then used another lightbulb and we predicted the light would be evenly spread however, we were wrong. One of the light bulbs didn't light up! This was because of the positioning we soon came to realize. Next we adjusted it and fixed our mistake. Finally we used an electric motor and fan to create a reaction that allowed the fan to hover in the air then coming back down.

After lunch we did a fun quiz where we had to search round the room for our answers. The workers were so surprised when we all got full marks. They were so impressed with everybody and their behavior.

knowledge. The children review knowledge regularly to help them do this.






Some parents are saying that their children are coming home and talking about Community, Aspiration, Resilience and Emotional Wellbeing.
